

Expedition Checklist

1. Does the school have a planned programme of expedition training for young people delivered by appropriately qualified and/or competent staff?
2. Does the school have a formal process for inducting staff into supporting expedition delivery?
3. Can your expedition leader(s) demonstrate competence to lead and supervise activities in non-remote territory and remote terrain as required?

4. Is there a programme of regular training and development available for staff accompanying expeditions?
5. Do your expedition leader(s) keep up-to-date records of the awards they hold. <https://oeapng.info/download/1084/>
6. Will each expedition team (max 7 students for DofE purposes) be overseen by an adult whose walking and leadership skills has been assessed as being competent by someone with a relevant National Governing Body award? <https://www.mountain-training.org/about/qualification-matrices>
7. Will expedition teams (max 7 students for DofE purposes) be overseen by an adult who holds a current first aid award at an appropriate level for the nature of the expedition?
